

## SHOW RULES

1. All shows are open to members and non-members alike.
2. All exhibits to be own work, or grown by the exhibitor in fruit, vegetable and flower classes (excluding class N40 in the November Show). Varieties should be named.
3. An exhibitor may stage no more than three exhibits in each class, except where otherwise stated.
4. Juniors may exhibit in an adult class.
5. Exhibitors may use their own vases.
6. Plates are provided and must be used where specified.
7. Exhibitors must accept the space allotted to them by the Show Managers.
8. The decision of the judges will be final.
9. Exhibits must not be removed before the presentation of the trophies.
10. All prizes will be paid out not later than 4.00 pm on the day of the show.
11. Exhibits can be staged from 7.30 pm – 9.00 pm on Friday and 8.30 am – 11.30 am on Saturday.
12. Judging to NCS, NVS and NDS rules where applicable.
13. In the interests of the Society the Committee reserves the right to add classes on the day of a show. Judges will be advised prior to judging.
14. Points awarded: 1<sup>st</sup> = 3 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> = 2 points, 3<sup>rd</sup> = 1 point.

#### **CLASS 101 - BANANA CAKE RECIPE**

##### **INGREDIENTS**

225g self raising flour                      175g sugar

115g butter                                      2 eggs

2 large or 3 medium very ripe bananas

##### **METHOD**

Mash the bananas with a sturdy fork. Cream together the butter and sugar and mix in the eggs. Mix together the two yellow mixtures you now have. Fold in the flour. Put in a greased 2lb loaf tin and bake for 40 minutes at 180°C / 160°C fan / gas 4, then lower temperature to 150°C / 130°C fan / gas 2 and cook for a further 30 minutes. Allow to cool.

**2018 Top Vase Class****Summer Show Class 57 p 3**

The Top Vase class is for a vase of mixed flowering stems containing a total of between 5 and 10, taken from a minimum of two different kinds of plants. Please note that is two different KINDS of plants, two varieties of the same plants are NOT two kinds.

The display is judged out of a total of 35 with points split into 25 points for the colour, form, condition, quality and freshness of the flowers on display, and 10 points for the overall presentation and effects of the flowers in the vase. The flowers will be viewed from all directions. Judging of flowers should be to the normal rules for other classes.
